

Defining Search Goals



The SMART goals you submitted to the program will help guide you through the search process and ensure you set aside proper time to secure an internship

Setting aside time to search for an internship is an extremely important part of the process and will determine your success




SMART Goal

Example:

“I will search for internships every Sunday from 12:00pm-3:00pm, applying for two internships per week. If I have not secured an internship halfway into the quarter, I will increase my internship search to 5 applications per week. I will work to have an internship secured three weeks before we leave for DC.”

Do's and Don'ts



- Set aside time for your search in the same way you would a regular class
- Keep and regularly update a search log
- Focus on skills you want to gain for your future career goals

- Wait to start looking
- Search too narrowly or too broadly
- Focus only on the “big names” to put on a resume
