Course Objectives

WAS 192 is a course designed to complement your internship experience through the Washington Program. This course allows you to receive 8 units of academic credit for the work you do at your internship. To receive course credit, you must work at least the minimum number of hours, complete the student experience form, and receive a satisfactory evaluation of your internship performance from your supervisor.

All internship requirements are essential, and students will not receive credit unless all requirements are satisfactorily completed.

Grading

The course grade for WAS 192 is pass/fail and is based on the following components [a passing grade is equivalent to a C- on a graded scale]:

- Working a minimum number of hours (academic year – 24 to 32 hrs.) or (summer – 32 to 40 hrs.).
- Complete student experience form
- Satisfactory evaluation of internship performance from supervisor

Working a minimum number of hours: To satisfy the requirements for your internship, you must work a minimum number of hours. These hours will depend on when you go through the program. Students that go through the program during the regular academic year need to complete 24-32 hours per week. Student attending program during the summer must complete 32-40 hours per week. The minimum number of hours for a 10-week quarter is 240. It is the responsibility of the student and supervisor to keep track of hours worked.

Complete Student Experience Form: Students will be required to complete the student experience form at the end of the quarter by the deadline set by the program. The student experience form is designed to get your feedback on different aspects of your internship experience. The survey links to this form will be sent to you during week 8. Follow the survey link and answer all of the questions asked to the best of your ability.

Satisfactory evaluation of internship performance: To satisfy the requirements of your internship you must receive a satisfactory internship performance evaluation from your supervisor. It is the student's responsibility to remind their supervisor to complete this evaluation at the end of the quarter.
